What is this fact sheet about?





- helps people fight a virus if they come in contact with it
- can stop people from getting very sick from the virus.



The COVID-19 vaccine is a safe way to protect:

- you
- your family
- the community.



A **vaccination** is when you receive an injection of the vaccine. This is done with a needle.



We want to give everyone in Australia a chance to have a COVID-19 vaccination.



But we can't give everyone the vaccination at the same time.



We want as many people as possible to have the vaccination in 2021.

Who will get the COVID-19 vaccination first?



Some people will have their COVID-19 vaccination first.



This includes people who are more at risk of:

- catching the virus
- getting very sick if they catch the virus.



We call these **priority groups**.



There is a team of medical experts called the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI).



The ATAGI decides who is in a priority group.

From June 2021, you are in a priority group if you are over 16 years old and you:



 are a person with disability who lives with at least one other person with disability



• are a person with serious health problems



 are a person who uses supports and services with other people with disability



take part in the NDIS



are an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person.



You are also in a priority group if you are aged 40 years or older.



If you are in one of these priority groups, you can book your COVID-19 vaccination now.

Other people who are also in a priority group now include:



• people who work in disability accommodation



• people who live in aged care



• people who work in aged care



 people who care for an NDIS participant of any age



doctors and health workers



• quarantine workers.



If someone returns from overseas, the government asks them to stay in a hotel.

We call this quarantine.

To find out if you are in a priority group, you can:



 use the COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility Checker on the Healthdirect Australia website at www.covid-vaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/ eligibility



• talk to your doctor



• talk to the people who support you.



Family members who are not carers of people with disability are not in a priority group.

But they might belong in a priority groups for another reason, such as:



a health problem



• their job.
