Australia's Disability Strategy



The government set up **Australia's Disability Strategy**.

We call it **the Strategy** for short.

It was also called ADS.



The Strategy is the governments way of working together to support people with disability to live good lives.

They do this by working with

- People with disability
- The community.

This makes the community a more welcoming place for everyone.

What are Targeted Action Plans



We made small plans to help us work on the Strategy.

The small plans are called **Targeted Action Plans**.

We call them TAPs for short



TAPs are made by **all governments** in Australia.

All governments include

- Australian Government
- State and territory governments
- Local governments.



There are 3 TAPs.

1. Community **Attitudes**



Attitudes are what people

- Think
- Feel
- Believe.



2. Inclusive Homes and Communities



Inclusive is when everyone

- Can take part
- Feel like they **belong**.



3. Safety **Rights** and **Justice**



Rights are **rules** about treating everyone

- Fair
- Equal.



Justice is

- The law
- Police
- The courts
- Prisons.

Laws are **rules** for how we live.

• What people think about disability.



This TAP wants to help

More people with disability to be leaders



 Help employers know what good workers people with disability are

An employer is someone who pays someone to do work for them.



 Workers know how to support people with disability



 Help the community have better attitudes about people with disability.

Thinking about experiences



This TAP will look at how to

 Support people with disability and the different parts of who they are.

This might change what their experience is like.

This is called **intersectionality**.

 People with disability who live in rural or remote areas



• First Nations people with disability



• People who speak different languages



People from different cultures



Women and girls with disability



 People with disability who are LGBTQIA+



Children and young people with disability.



Some people fit into more than 1 of these groups.

National Actions



The Australian Government will work with people with disability on this TAP.

All governments will put the plan into action.



All governments will work on the actions over the next 3 years.



They will also work with people with disability.

Helping people with disability work in government



1 action in the TAP is about helping people with disability work in government.



The **Australian Public Service Commission** is doing a project.

We call them **APSC** for short.



The project is

Making goals to hire more people with disability

Hire means pay them money to do work.



APSC is asking workers with disability what they think.



APSC has made a **working group** with state and territory governments.

Working groups are a group of people working together on a topic.



This will help to

• Share ideas



• Agree on rules.

Data about community attitudes



The Strategys survey collects **data** over a long time.



Data is

- Facts
- Information
- Records.



It collects data from people

• All over Australia



• With disability



Who hire people
