Australia's Disability Strategy



The government set up **Australia's Disability Strategy**.

We call it the Strategy for short.

It was also called ADS.



The Strategy is the governments way of working together to support people with disability to live good lives.

They do this by working with

- People with disability
- The community.

This makes the community a more welcoming place for everyone.

What are Targeted Action Plans



We made small plans to help us work on the Strategy.

The small plans are called TAPs.



TAPs are made by **all governments** in Australia.

All governments include

- Australian Government
- State and territory governments
- Local governments.



There are 3 TAPs.

1. Community Attitudes



2. Inclusive Homes and Communities



Inclusive is when everyone

- Can take part
- Feel like they **belong**.



3. Safety Rights and Justice



Some governments do **not** have actions in all 3 TAPs.

They might have actions in only some of TAPs.

 EmployAbility Strategy

We call it **NTPS EmployAbility Strategy** for short.



The NTPS EmployAbility Strategy says people with disability can get help with

 Better assistive technology and things to help at work



Assistive technology can be things to help you

- Speak
- Move
- See
- Hear.



• Leadership mentoring

Mentors are someone you talk to for advice.



Support for disability programs like

• **Employment** programs

Employment is

- o Having a job
- Going to work
- Getting money for the work you do.



• Graduate programs

A graduate program is a program when someone has finished learning at university.

They start a new job using the skills they learned.



• Trainee program.

Trainee programs are when you learn while you work.

Safety Rights and Justice TAP



This TAP wants to make sure people with disability are

- Safe
- Treated fairly.



The NT **Department of Corrections** is working on ways to support people with disability in prison.

We call them **DoC** for short.



They are

• Improving the ways things are done



 Looking for ways to work with community organisations



 Making sure workers are respecting people they support

Like

o First Nations people



o Women



o Young people



o LGBTQIA+ people.



Some people with disability in prison might have

Health needs



• Emotional needs.



Prisons need to think of these needs.



Some people with disability in prison already have NDIS supports.



More people with disability are getting assessments done by allied health workers.

Assessments help us work out what support you need.



Allied health workers support people with their health.

They can be people like **occupational therapists**.

We call them **OT** for short.



All workers doing assessments need to take part in **clinical supervision**.

Clinical supervision helps workers

Do their job safely



• Make sure their work is respectful



• Are culturally safe

Culturally safe means respecting peoples

- o Rights
- Cultures
- o Traditions.

This helps people feel safe to be themselves.



• Meet each persons needs.
