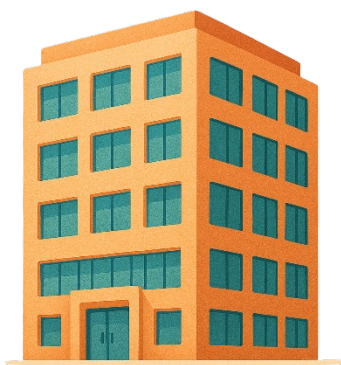

We use pictures to explain some ideas.

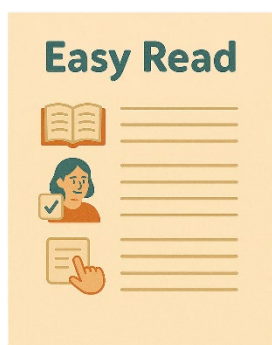

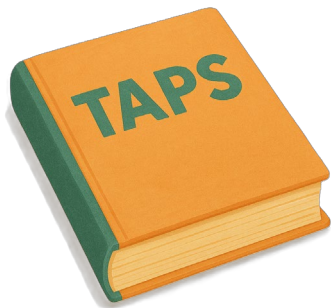

We call it **the Strategy** for short.

It was also called **ADS**.



The Strategy is the governments way of working together to support people with disability to live good lives.

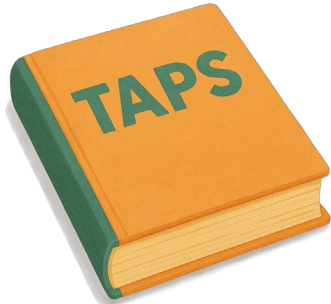
They do this by working with

- People with disability
- The community.

This makes the community a more welcoming place for everyone.



# What are Targeted Action Plans



We made small plans to help us work on the Strategy.

The small plans are called **TAPs**.



TAPs are made by **all governments** in Australia.

All governments include

- Australian Government
- State and territory governments
- Local governments.

# Community Attitudes TAP



This TAP wants to change

- How people **behave**

Behave means

- How you act
- What you do.



What people think about disability.



1 of the actions the SA government is working on is

- The Inkling Pilot Program.



This program is being done by the **Office for Autism**.

A **pilot program** is a test program.

It is used to try out new ideas.



This program will be done across all of SA.



It will help families

- Understand
- Celebrate

**Neurodiversity.**



Neurodiversity is the way peoples brains work differently.

Everyone thinks and feels differently.

They are normal differences.



# Inclusive Homes and Communities TAP



This TAP wants to make

- Homes



- The community

Easier to access.



We also want them to be more welcoming.



The SA government is working with SA Housing Trust.

They are working on a project called

- **Disability Housing Program**



The Housing Trust is

- **Reviewing**
- Updating

The Disability Housing Program.



A review is when you check what

- Works
- Needs to change.



They have a **goal**.

Goals are things you want to do.



They want to **replace** old homes with new accessible homes.

Replace means change 1 thing for another.



This work is being done with

- People with disability



- Community housing providers.



**Consultations** in the future will talk to **tenants**.



Consultation is the governments way of working with the disability community.

It makes sure that the government is listening to communities.

This helps the government make better plans to support people with disability.



Tenants are the people who pay rent to live in the homes.



This will make sure that the housing meets their

- Needs
- Goals.

# Safety Rights and Justice TAP



This TAP wants to make sure people with disability are

- Safe
- Treated fairly.



The SA government is working on the

- **Community Visitors Scheme.**



The **Community Visitor Scheme** visit people with disability.

We call it **CVS** for short.

CVS make sure people with disability

- Are getting the services they need
- Have their **rights** respected.





There is a change to CVS.

CVS can now visit

- Disability services **not** run by the government



- Private homes.



The SA government is part of a **national project** making sure CVS is the same across all Australia.

A national project is something that all states and territories are working on





People with disability are helping with the changes to CVS.

They are doing this by taking part in

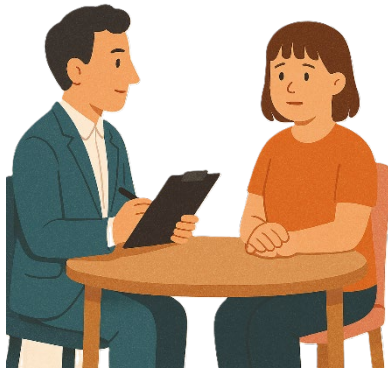


- **Working groups with Disability Representative Organisations**

We call it **DROs** for short.



Working groups are a group of people working together on a topic.



- Interviews to hear what people think about
  - Safety
  - Rights



- **Surveys** to get **feedback** from the community.

Surveys have questions about your ideas.



Feedback says what you think about something.

It will help

- Find problems
- Make it better in the future.



More people will be able to share their ideas.

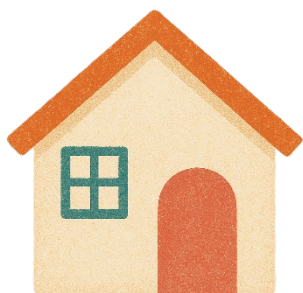
Including people who live in

- **Supported accommodation**

Supported accommodation is for people with disability.

People with disability can

- Live in a house paid for by the NDIS
- Get support to live in the house



- Private homes.



They could be

- First Nations people



- People from different cultures



- People with **psychosocial disability**

Psychosocial disability is when some people have a disability because of their mental health.
